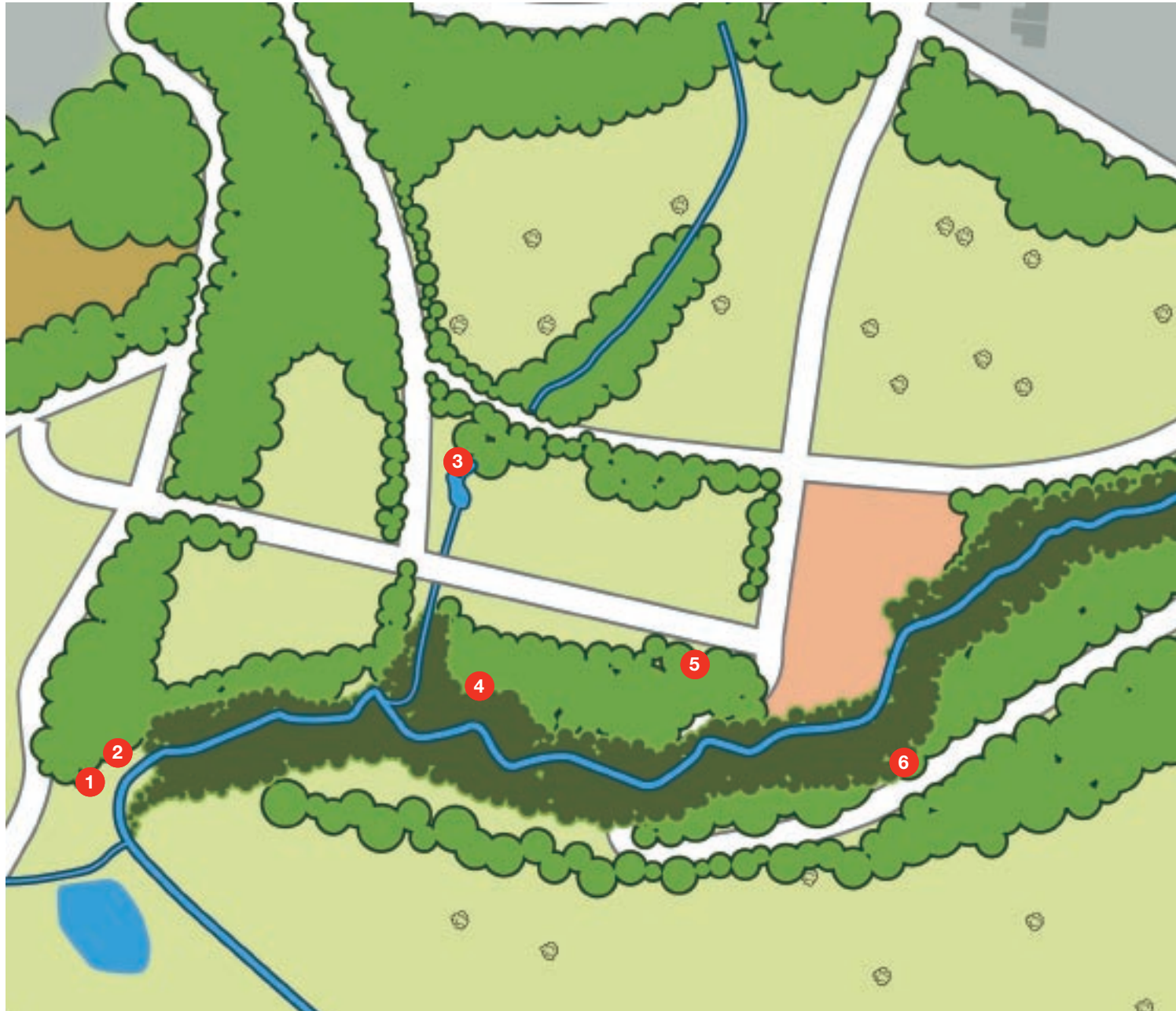

1. Covenanters Oak
